And the Lord said unto Moses, Come up to me into the mount, and be there: and I will give thee tables of stone, and a law, and commandments which I have written; that thou mayest teach them.

And Moses rose up, and his minister Joshua: and Moses went up into the mount of God.

And he said unto the elders, Tarry ye here for us, until we come again unto you: and, behold, Aaron and Hur are with you: if any man have any matters to do, let him come unto them.

And Moses went up into the mount, and a cloud covered the mount.

Recycling Initiatives Update The recycling columns were emptied on 6 February with a further black bag containing 3,615 milk container tops sent for recycling meaning since the start of this initiative some 65,652 milk container tops have been recycled and saved from going to landfill. Thank you for your support of this and our other recycling initiatives.
