Bereavement Point at St Andrew's Church

A place where your grief is welcome

Experiencing the death of a loved one can be very difficult. Sometimes, for all sorts of reasons, we don't feel able to talk about this to those around us.

Maybe you would like to talk with others in a similar position about what grieving is like, or you simply don't have anyone else to talk to about it?

We offer a drop in service that provides a space for you to talk openly to experienced and caring facilitators, and to share with others who are living with grief and loss. Bereavement Point is a place that offers comfort and a listening ear and enables you to connect with others who are experiencing the same.

We are not counsellors, rather caring people, who offer support and listening and to be a companion to you in your grief.

No need to book – just come along.

We are here on the 1st, 3rd and 5th Tuesdays (if there is one) of each month 14:00 – 15:30
