



#### **New Testament Reading**

A reading from the eighth chapter of The Acts of the Apostles, beginning at the twenty sixth verse.

Then an angel of the Lord said to Philip, 'Get up and go towards the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.' (This is a wilderness road.) So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. Then the Spirit said to Philip, 'Go over to this chariot and join it.' So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, 'Do you understand what you are reading?' He replied, 'How can I, unless someone guides me?' And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this:

'Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth. In his humiliation justice was denied him.

Who can describe his generation?

For his life is taken away from the earth.'

The eunuch asked Philip, 'About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?' Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, 'Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?' He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. When

they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.


# The Eucharistic Prayer please remain standing

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness; We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son. On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

The sanctuary bell is rung


So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.



Recycling - Your contributions are most welcome and continue to support the Church as well as other charities. There is a separate yellow collection bin for your unwanted spectacles, due perhaps to a change in your prescription. The recycling unit has two columns the left hand column is for the collection of **ink** cartridges and the right hand column is for milk container caps. Please assist the sorting and packing process by not placing items in the wrong column or by placing general waste in either of the columns. Where possible only deposit the ink cartridge without their original cardboard packaging as we can only send the ink cartridges for recycling. The soft plastics (bags) in which items are deposited are recycled separately to further reduce waste. Don't forget your used postage stamps to support the Knitted Knockers Charity that provides wool for Breast Replacements for women who have had a mastectomy, and your unwanted mobile telephones will be transported to Ghana by the charity NPAC -National Police Aid Convoy - where they are handed to the charity Afrikids to help in technology training and repair and reuse. Thank you for your ongoing support of these valuable initiatives.
