Pilgrimage Sunday. On Sunday 26th October we will be making a parish pilgrimage to Coventry Cathedral and we would love it if as many as possible would join it. After a blessing in church at 10.30am, a coach (or coaches!) will leave St Andrew's for Coventry, where we will tour the cathedral ruins and some other historic Christian sites in the city centre. We will then be welcomed into the cathedral to share lunch and have a tour led by one of the clergy. We will celebrate the eucharist together in the early afternoon, and join the cathedral congregation for Evensong at 4pm before returning to Rugby by coach at 5pm. There will be a said service with hymns in church for those who wish to remain here.

Town Centre Regeneration St Andrew's is delighted to be partnering with Rugby Borough Council and the Friends of St Andrew's for a major programme of cleaning, repair and refurbishment to the north side of the church. These works are the result of much careful planning and consultation and will allow one of the jewels in our town centre's architectural crown to shine brightly once again.

Without external partnerships, St Andrew's could not begin to afford work on this scale. With them, the refurbishment of St Andrew's will be a key part of a regeneration plan to transform the attractiveness of our town centre to the huge benefit of everyone in our community.
