## ***The Liturgy of the Word***

### **Reading**

*(24.12-end)*

A reading from the book of Exodus

So Moses set out with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up into the mountain of God. **Recycling Initiatives Update** The recycling columns were emptied on 6 February with a further black bag containing 3,615 milk container tops sent for recycling meaning since the start of this initiative some 65,652 milk container tops have been recycled and saved from going to landfill. Thank you for your support of this and our other recycling initiatives.
